Knowledge management

- Developed three reports which housed valuable knowledge and development solutions on COVID-19 pandemic, agroforestry system, and bamboo industry.
- Identified and documented 15 good practices and facilitated their inclusion in the *Good Practices in South-South and Triangular Cooperation for Sustainable Development Volume 3*.

Supporting SSTC projects through small grants

- Appraised, approved, and granted for implementation four demand-driven small-grant proposals which were developed from proposal templates with enhanced Monitoring and Reporting component, benefiting five developing countries from six regions.

Capacity development

- Organized three online capacity development and knowledge sharing exchanges/webinars, attracting 200 attendees among which 95% rated the webinars as highly satisfactory.
- Organized six capacity development and knowledge sharing exchanges events, despite the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Increased over 1000 participants' knowledge and skills.

Partnership building and resource mobilization

- Mobilized parallel funding at the value of USD 258,800 from small grant implementing partners for scaling up efforts.
- Facilitated the establishment of five partnerships in South-South cooperation for advancing SDGs.
- Expanded project partnership base through knowledge sharing and capacity development activities, including engaging eight UN agencies and international organizations.

Communication and advocacy

- Increased project visibility and expanded partnership base through active participation in 16 online/offline inter-agency experience sharing workshops/seminars for mutual learning, and creating a landing page of the project on UNOSSC's global partnership building and knowledge sharing platform South-South Galaxy.
- Disseminated a broad range of multi-media communication and advocacy products through various platforms, including over 1000 copies/downloads of knowledge products at conference venues and through online platforms.
- Increased the visibility of partners' donation of funds and medical supplies worth approx. USD 3.6 million for COVID-19 responses, benefitting people in more than 20 African, Asian, and Latin American countries, by publicizing these efforts through UNOSSC and GSSDC media channels.

Office capacity development

- Enhanced understanding and knowledge on M&E tools and methods applied to implement M&E through completing three capacity building trainings on results-based planning, monitoring & reporting system and M&E tools and outcome level indicators.

In 1974, the United Nations General Assembly established the **United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation** (hereafter as “UNOSSC”, named as “Special Unit for Technical Cooperation between Developing Countries” at that time), an independent entity mandated to promote, coordinate and support South-South and triangular cooperation globally and within the United Nations system. Guided by the High-level Committee on South-South Cooperation, and under the direct leadership of Envoy of Secretary General on South-South Cooperation, UNOSSC provides support to the Member States, intergovernmental organizations and United Nations agencies in the areas of policy advocacy and coordination, strategy research, knowledge sharing, technology exchange, capacity building, and innovative South-South Cooperation projects, to facilitate the partnership building and resource mobilization for the South-South and triangular Cooperation for Sustainable Development. UNDP has been entrusted by the United Nations General Assembly to provide budgetary and operational support to the UNOSSC since its inception.

Directly under the Ministry of Commerce of China, **China International Center for Economic and Technical Exchanges** (CICETE) was founded in 1983 with the approval of the State Council. CICETE’s main function, delegated by the Ministry, is to coordinate the cooperation between China and UNDP, United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) including implementing their assisted programs to China, and to manage projects of general goods supply, South-South Cooperation Assistance Fund projects, Human Resource Development Cooperation projects under the China-Aid programme with other developing countries. CICETE has also been actively organizing high-level conferences, exhibitions and professional trainings, invites international short-term and long-term experts, and provides project management service to international organizations, government agencies and enterprises. In addition, CICETE has also been cooperating actively with international non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and enterprises.

The **Global South-South Development Center Project** (Global SSDC) was jointly initiated by UNOSSC and CICETE building on the 10 years achievements of the China SSDC project. During the past ten-year, the China SSDC Project has achieved encouraging results in consolidating South-South cooperation expertise and resources in China, promoting economic and technical cooperation between China and other developing countries through the PPP model. The new Global SSDC Project (2019-2024) will build on the China SSC Network of expertise and resources and reprofile itself as a global network of centers of excellence for SSC in advancing SDGs and aims to engage southern centers of excellences outside China, and build sub-centers of excellence in line with regional priorities to become a globally-focused platform to facilitate and implement South-South and triangular cooperation (SSTC).



“100 Questions, 100 Answers” series


In 2020, Global SSDC Project worked closely with the Center for International Knowledge on Development (CIKD) on China’s experiences in fighting the pandemic. While China had seen a significant decline of COVID-19 cases, the rest of the world was still faced with a surge in new cases and fatalities. To increase the understanding of China’s key measures on prevention and control of the COVID-19 outbreak comprehensively and objectively, CIKD, with the support from Global SSDC Project, developed the **“100 Questions, 100 Answers” series**. Centered around the most widely discussed questions on COVID-19, this series aims to enhance the people’s general knowledge and understanding of China’s experience in responding to the health crisis.


Eliminating Extreme Poverty through Forest-Fungi Agroforestry System in Rural Asia



China sees the year 2020 as a milestone, when the goal of eliminating absolute poverty and comprehensively achieving a “Xiaokang Society”, meaning full emergence as a moderately prosperous country, will be realized. China’s poverty alleviation work and achievements provides valuable experiences for the global fight against impoverishment. This report, entitled “**Eliminating Extreme Poverty through Forest-Fungi Agroforestry System in Rural Asia**” summarizes forest-fungi agroforestry’s outstanding contributions in terms of increasing smallholders’ income, scaling up ecological restoration in mountain area and promoting the sustainable development of local farming communities, which is proved to be replicable and adaptable.

The Report on the Situation, Potential and Prospect of Bamboo Industry in Rwanda



In 2019, supported by Global SSDC Project, China National Bamboo Research Center organized a field trip to Rwanda to study, assess and document the experience and lessons of **China Aid Rwanda Bamboo Planting, Processing and Utilization Project** in the past 10 years. Following the trip, this report was released in 2020, echoing the calls made by UN Secretary General António Guterres on the International Day of Forests (21 March) to “take urgent action to halt deforestation and restore degraded forests, so future generations can enjoy a greener, healthier future”. Riding on the facts and findings provided by the report, “To Develop a Market-driving Green Bamboo Concrete Board Industry in Rwanda”, a small-grant proposal under Global SSDC Project, was initiated in 2020 to promote the development of green bamboo concrete board industry in Rwanda through public-private partnership (PPP) and help develop contextualized and demand-driven solutions to address local development challenges.

→ **Capacity development trainings**

As the global pandemic, COVID-19 spreads rapidly to almost every corner of the world, it threatens to profoundly deepen inequalities and undo the progress on sustainable development done over the decades. Due to the global COVID-19 pandemic, several planned awareness-building and experience-sharing seminars/workshops, as well as fact-finding missions, under the framework of Global SSDC, were postponed/ cancelled.

The project office constantly adjusted its workplan to ensure smooth project implementation amidst changing situations. Close contact has been kept with the partner institutions to brainstorm possible solutions, and, based on partners' real needs, synergize their capacities and capabilities for effective collaboration and ultimately accelerate the innovation of South-South cooperation and international development cooperation. Since June 2020, the project team had adopted a proactive approach to prepare for demand-driven capacity development and knowledge sharing exchanges seminars/ workshops / forums both online and in-person.

Webinar series: South-South Cooperation and International Development Cooperation in the Post COVID-19 World

To improve the effectiveness of the virtual meeting and provide a better understanding of partners' particular development interest and foster mutual understanding for further collaboration among partners, an online needs survey was undertaken by the project office. Survey results indicated that partners were concerned about, among others, whether and how the COVID-19 pandemic would reshape future South-South cooperation and international development cooperation, what opportunities and challenges the pandemic would bring to international cooperation, and how South-South cooperation and international development cooperation could be strengthened in the post COVID-19 world. Based on the needs received, the project office designed the event concept and invited relevant partners to join.




→ **Webinar 2** focused on sustainable agriculture was held on 10 September 2020, brought together nearly 60 representatives from expert institutions of multi fields.







Offline Capacity Development and knowledge sharing exchanges events

The 2020 South-South Cooperation and Digital Economy Development Forum took place in Chongqing City, China from 25-26 November. Under the theme “Digital Economy Cooperation among Developing Countries in the Post-Epidemic Era”, speakers from UN agencies, the Chinese government, embassies in China, and research institutes highlighted the role of South-South cooperation in bridging the digital divide and ensuring the inclusive and sustainable development of the digital economy. The Forum was co-hosted by the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade Chongqing Sub-council, Chongqing University, and the Chongqing International Cultural Communication Center, with the support of the CICETE and the Global SSDC Project.

Ms. Xiaojun Grace Wang, Deputy Director of the United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC), highlighted in her video message that “As a pioneer in the digital economy, China has been helping other developing countries employ digital technologies to accelerate poverty alleviation and encourage sustainable development with the application of digital technologies in the five priority areas under the ‘Belt and Road’ Initiative.”

The 25th Annual Meeting of the China South-South Cooperation Network (CSSCN), two thematic workshops, and an exhibition on China’s good practices in South-South and triangular cooperation, hosted by the China SSC Network and organized by the Chongqing International Cultural Communication Center, one of the member institutions of China SSC Network, took place in parallel to the 2020 South-South Cooperation and Digital Economy Development Forum. The annual meeting saw an attendance of more than 60 representatives from United Nations World Food Programme (WFP), CSSCN member institutions and organizations interested in joining the CSSCN.



→ SURVEY RESULTS




OVERALL GENDER REPRESENTATION AMONG PARTICIPANTS




OVERALL AGE COMPOSITION AMONG PARTICIPANTS




WHICH SECTORS DO PARTICIPANTS WORK FOR?







Seminar on China-Africa Private Sector Cooperation

2020 marked the 20th anniversary of the founding of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC), which had earned worldwide attention to the cooperation between China and Africa. China-Africa cooperation has been spearheading SSC. At the United Nations Security Council High-level Debate on “Cooperation between

the United Nations and Regional and Sub-regional Organizations with a Specific Focus on the United Nations and the African Union” on December 4th 2020, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi said, “China stands as a true friend of African countries and a partner with common purpose. Guided by the principle of sincerity, real results, amity and good faith, China has put the greater good of African countries above its own interests. We are always ready to play a part as the African people pursue their grand vision of development.”

Against this background, supported by Global SSDC Project and hosted by China-Africa Business Council, the **Seminar on China-Africa Private Sector Cooperation** was held on 11 December. As an important part of the 2020 China-Africa Private Sector Cooperation Forum, the Seminar was attended by experts from CIKD, the China-Africa Development Fund (CADF), the Project Office of the UNIDO Centre for South-South Industrial Cooperation, and the South-South Cooperation Research Center of Nankai University. Participants exchanged ideas over international business cooperation, China-Africa cooperation in investment and financing, industrial parks, and China-Africa production capacity cooperation. The Seminar was also joined by over 120 guests from the embassies of developing countries in China, local trade promotion councils, financial institutions, chambers of commerce, guilds, investors in Africa, and young entrepreneurs.

Partnerships

Global SSDC Project brings together resources and expertise from various industries and sectors. It provides comprehensive support including capacity development and on-site practical trainings, as well as direct implementation of small-grant proposals.

In 2020, five institutions joined the China SSC Network under auspices of Global SSDC project office, bringing the total number of member institutions to 36 by January 2021. (Chongqing International Culture Exchange Centre,

Fujian Association of Science, Technology and Cultural Innovation, National Medical Products Administration Institute of Executive Development, World Food Programme China Center of Excellence and College of International Development and Global Agriculture of China Agricultural University).

In particular, the partnership with WFP China CoE, was a significant step towards a global platform.

The 2020 China-Africa Private Sector Cooperation Forum was held in Beijing on the afternoon of December 11th, 2020, with a focus on industrial and trade cooperation between China and Africa in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Forum was attended by more than 10 African diplomatic envoys and over 100 representatives from Chinese and African government departments, academia, think-tanks, financial institutions, and the private sector, and joined by over 100,000 viewers from the Chinese and African business communities online. CICETE Deputy Director-General Zhang Yi was invited to the Forum.

From November 25 to 26, supported by CICETE and the Global South-South Development Center Project (Global SSCDC Project), the 25th Annual Meeting of China South-South Cooperation Network (hereinafter referred to as the annual meeting) and the 2020 South-South Cooperation & Digital Economy Development Forum (hereinafter referred to as the Digital Forum), were successfully held in Chongqing. CICETE Deputy Director-General Zhang Yi attended the meetings and delivered a speech respectively.

The annual meeting saw an attendance of more than 80 representatives from United Nations World Food Programme (WFP), China South-South Cooperation Network (CSSCN) member institutions and organizations interested in joining the CSSCN. There was robust discussion at the annual meeting on the future development direction of CSSCN under the new situation and how to promote South-South and Triangular cooperation more extensively and deeply. After the speeches by organizer (Chongqing International Culture Exchange Centre), supporter (CICETE) and guest institution (WFP), a progress report of the CSSCN in 2020 was presented. Representatives from the member institutions who newly joined the CSSCN in 2020 introduced their efforts and experiences on international cooperation and South-South cooperation. In the session of 'Looking ahead during the pandemic and turning challenges into opportunities', representatives shared their experiences and innovative approaches.



In his speech, DGG Zhang Yi fully affirmed and appreciated the work and achievements made by the member institutions of CSSCN in promoting South-South and Triangular cooperation. It is hoped that member institutions could implement the new development concept of 'innovation, coordination, green, open and sharing', put forward by President Xi Jinping, carry forward the spirit of solidarity and cooperation, mutual benefit and win-win results, and work together to seek common development. DGG Zhang Yi also expressed that the CICETE, as a specialized project management agency, will spare no efforts to support the development of CSSCN through its functions, experiences and platform specialties, helping member institutions expand their international partnerships and making contribution to the UN Sustainable Development Goals and a community of shared future for mankind.



With the theme of 'working together for innovation and development', the Digital Forum focused on cooperation among developing countries in the field of digital economy in the post-pandemic era. More than 100 guests, including Mr. Li Bo, Vice Mayor of Chongqing Municipal Government, Ms. Xiaojun Grace Wang, Deputy Director of United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC), Mr. Zhou Yigang, Former Director of UNOSSC, Director Ding Yi, Digital Economy Expert of the United Nations Capital Development Fund, Mr. Lewis Quessada, Ambassador of Peru to China, Mr. Masuhir Rahman, Minister of Bangladesh to China, Mr. Ming Ju, Vice President of Chongqing University, discussed issues including South-South cooperation, digital economy, blockchain and trade in services, etc. Participants of the annual meeting were invited to attend the Digital Forum.

Private Sector Contributes to China-Africa South-South Cooperation for Sustainable Development

Organized by the China-Africa Business Council (CABC), the 2020 China-Africa Private Sector Cooperation Forum took place in Beijing, China, on 11 December 2020, with a focus on industrial and trade cooperation between China and Africa in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic. Participants substantiated the growing importance of the private sector in China-Africa South-South cooperation with quantitative evidence and case studies, and shared observations on key areas and trends of the cooperation.



South-South cooperation has expanded from technical cooperation to economic, trade, financial cooperation in recent years, because of the strong momentum in economic development and cooperation in the global South, especially the increased investment and trade cooperation. The Outcome Document of the Second High-level United Nations Conference on South-South Cooperation (BAPA+40), held in Argentina in 2019, highlighted the expanded scope of SSC which includes South-South trade and investment; and acknowledged the role played by multi-stakeholders, including the private sector, in promoting South-South and triangular cooperation (SSTC) for sustainable development.



China-Africa cooperation has been spearheading South-South cooperation. At the United Nations Security Council High-level Debate on "Cooperation between the United Nations and Regional and Sub-regional Organizations with a Specific Focus on the United Nations and the African Union" on 4 December 2020, Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi said, "China stands as a true friend of African countries and a partner with common purpose. Guided by the principle of equality, mutual results, unity and good faith, China has put the greater good of African countries above its own interests. We are always ready to play part as the African people pursue their grand vision of development."

Mr. Xu Lejiang, Executive Vice Chairman of the All-China Federation of Industry and Commerce shared that this year marked the 20th anniversary of the founding of the Forum on China-Africa Cooperation (FOCAC), which had earned worldwide attention in the cooperation between China and Africa. He further stated that, "the trade between China and Africa exceeded USD500 billion in 2019, which is 20 times the number of 2000. China's direct investment in Africa reached USD49.1 billion in the same year, which is 100 times higher than that of 2000, making China the largest trading partner of Africa for the 11th consecutive year. Contributing to over 20 per cent of the African economic growth for many years, China has become a critical driver of the sustained economic growth of the continent."

Mr. Wu Peng, Director-General of the African Affairs Department of China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs said, "As a sub-forum under the FOCAC framework, the China-Africa Private Sector Cooperation Forum has evolved as an important platform and flagship event for Chinese and African private businesses to communicate and cooperate. The Forum is held on schedule despite COVID-19 challenges. Such demonstrated the willingness and commitment of both China and Africa to promote cooperation and joint development." Looking ahead, Mr. Wu shared that cooperation and development would remain the top priority on the agenda of China-Africa cooperation and the next Forum to be held in Senegal in 2021 would certainly boost China-Africa cooperation in the post-pandemic era and offer Chinese and African private businesses more opportunities.

South-South Cooperation in Digital Economy Makes Technological Innovation Available to All

7 December, New York – The 2020 South-South Cooperation and Digital Economy Development Forum took place in Chongqing City, China from 25-26 November. Under the theme "Digital Economy Cooperation among Developing Countries in the Post-Epidemic Era", speakers from UN agencies, the Chinese government, embassies in China, and research institutes highlighted the role of South-South cooperation in bridging the digital divide and ensuring the inclusive and sustainable development of the digital economy.

The Forum was co-hosted by the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade (CCPIT), Chongqing University, and the Chongqing International Cultural Communication Center, with the support of the China International Center for Economic and Technical Exchanges and the Global South-South Development Center Project.

The digital economy has the potential to advance the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and it is believed to be an incubator of innovations and a transformative force in social governance. South-South cooperation among developing countries is guided by, among others, the principle of mutual benefits and self-reliance. It accelerates developing countries towards sustainable development through various means, including enhancing their capacities to integrate into the global economy. Despite the rapid digitalization of our socio-economic activities through technological advances such as artificial intelligence, big data, Internet of Things (IoT) and cloud computing, a digital gap persists between developed and developing countries, i.e. the "north" and the "south" and within different regions in the same country, threatening to widen the inequalities in developing countries, especially in the Least Developed Countries (LDCs). It is in this context that the digital economy becomes a priority area of South-South cooperation towards attaining the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and ensuring that no one is left behind.



Ms. Xiaojun Grace Wang, Deputy Director of the United Nations Office for South-South Cooperation (UNOSSC), highlighted in her video message that we must make technological innovation available to all. The advancement of the digital economy requires more international dialogues for forging consensus and facilitating decision-making. She added that at the national level, South-South cooperation should prioritize assisting developing countries in developing regulatory policies, business platforms, digital finance, infrastructure, etc. "As a pioneer in the digital economy, China has been helping other developing countries employ digital technologies to accelerate poverty alleviation and encourage sustainable development with the application of digital technologies in the five priority areas under the 'Belt and Road' Initiative." She called on more Chinese partners to leverage the digital economy to promote a more open, vigorous, and influential South-South cooperation and engage in South-South cooperation to foster a more inclusive and sustainable digital economy.

"In 2019, about 87 percent of the population living in developed countries had access to the Internet, whereas this figure was more 19 percent in the least developed world, indicating a huge gap among different countries and regions in the capacity of using digital data and cutting-edge technologies," said Mr. Yi Zhang, Deputy Director-General of China International Center for Economic and Technical Exchanges (CICETE). Zhang believes that the divide in digital access, utilization, and capacity, if not bridged, would intensify both international and domestic inequalities, result in greater adverse impact upon the vulnerable populations, and jeopardize developing countries in new technological revolutions and the digital economy. "It is of extraordinary significance to enhance cooperation in digital and intelligent technologies among developing countries and bridge the digital divide in a way that is faster and more sustainable by upholding the spirit of South-South cooperation underpinned by solidarity, cooperation, and self-reliance," concluded Zhang in his speech.

International Center on Small Hydro Power (ICSHP) and Partners Donate 240,000 Masks for COVID-19 Response

As of January 2021, ICSHP and its partners have donated 240,000 disposable surgical masks to support local COVID-19 responses, benefiting over ten developing countries in Africa, Asia and Pacific, and Latin America regions. In May, the ICSHP donated 5,000 urgently needed protective masks to the Secretariat of the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA). In October,

the ICSHP and the Dragon Design Foundation together donated 20,000 face masks to the UN System in Nigeria as part of the "Green Ribbon Action". In December, the ICSHP responded to the calls of its Nepalese partners by donating 210,000 disposable medical masks to the municipal governments of Khajura and Bardaghat in Nepal.

- In September, the project team participated in the **2nd “Aerial Silk Road” International Cooperation Summit 2020** and the **China International Fair for Investment & Trade** during China International Fair for Trade in Services, respectively to increase project visibility.

- On September 10, the project office received the delegation from **Chongqing International Culture Exchange Centre** to detail the preparation for the 25th annual meeting of China SSC Network.
- On September 17, the project office received the delegation from **China-Africa Business Council**. Both sides exchanged views on how to better promote the implementation of a waste management small- grant proposal.
